Reflection – God's Plan for Every Soul is Glorious from the Beginning to the End

God predestined us to be His children. *He predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with His pleasure and will (Ephesians 1:5).* God is pleased to make us His children through the graces Jesus won for us on the cross. We are no less than members of God's family! That makes us co-heirs with Jesus Christ, the only Son of God! *Now if we are children, then we are heirs - heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in His sufferings in order that we may also share in His glory (Romans 8:17).*

If we share the sufferings of Jesus then we also share His glory (cf Romans 8:17). No one on earth can pretend life is easy. Suffering touches every soul because of the existence of sin. The Passion of Jesus gives meaning to our own suffering. United to His Passion, our human sufferings can share in the infinite merits of His divine suffering, making it possible for our suffering to be meritorious, redemptive and infinite in value. Jesus gives us each a chance to sip from His bitter chalice for our purification and to help in the salvation of others especially those closest to us. Each and every one of us have a unique role in God's master plan of salvation (cf. Colossians 1:24). Just as Jesus let Simon of Cyrene help carry His cross, He desires our help in bringing about God's master plan of salvation. Far from leading useless lives, we share in Christ's divine mission in bringing God's kingdom down to earth. But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His wonderful light (1 Peter 2:9).

The triumph of grace over sin. Where sin increased, grace increased all the more (cf Romans 5:20). Man uses his freewill in pursuing the desires of his lower self, thereby distancing himself from God. God has a solution and provides for every misfortune that befalls a soul. The triumph over sin is brought about by Jesus Christ through His life, death and resurrection. Through His death on the Cross, Jesus won for us all the graces we need to live in righteousness and eventually to be made worthy for heaven. Through His command to the Apostles to perpetuate His Sacrifice (cf. Luke 22:19) through the Mass, Jesus gave His representatives the power to transmit His saving graces all over the world every day.
